I consider our audiences to come from both subjective individuals and people from a collective presence. Here at Heidi Duckler Dance, our performances engage many different individuals from diverse perspectives and a collective audience as a positive democratic act of commonality.

We bring our personal histories to the communal experience of "audiencing". When we are apart, fragmentary experiences can be amplified by the internet, our cell phones, laptops, and other multiple platforms that continue to isolate us from one another. This digital divide can cause mistrust, confusion, and insincerity. When we gather to view a site-specific performance at Heidi Duckler Dance, we are invited to experience art from multiple points of view. And these different perspectives can be uniting. Even with conflicting positions about the same performance, our sense of belonging can help us feel, as viewers, the sensations of the performers in our bodies and minds.

In addition, at our salons and festivals, we are given space to meet each other, a time to find language to talk about what we have experienced – to articulate our thoughts and sensations and perhaps we may even feel inspired to construct and express our own authentic stories. These shared moments are what we value. We welcome each one of you to join us for this kinesthetic and empathetic pleasure and experience the joy as we work to provide new opportunities to come closer as a people in 2024!

IN-SCHOOL RESIDENCIES WITH HEIDI DUCKLER DANCE (HDD)

HDD's skilled teaching artists lead in-school programming by utilizing VAPA standardsbased exercises for each session. Each class is designed to challenge students to rethink their definition of dance while encouraging them to explore movement through visual, kinesthetic, and auditory learning techniques. HDD aims to promote social engagement, self-confidence, and self-expression amongst students.

INTRODUCING SITE-SPECIFIC DANCE THROUGH ASSEMBLIES

HDD teaching artists visit schools to introduce the fundamentals of site-specific dance to both students and teachers. The visit includes an entertaining performance featuring a mix of improvised and choreographed pieces. Students have the opportunity to engage in interactive movement activities with their peers. These assemblies enable students to explore selfawareness, expand their imaginations, and broaden their understanding of dance.

HEIDI DUCKLER DANCE WORKSHOPS

Our workshops focus on a range of themes customized for varying audiences from schools to families to the general public. These sessions showcase the company's core methodology and are crafted to empower participants in utilizing their bodies, imaginations, intentions, and peer connections to create relationships and narratives rooted in personal experiences.


AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMS
