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Heidi Duckler Dance Takes Brazil! Dança Em Trânsito Festival



LOS ANGELES (July, 19 2024) – Los Angeles-based dance company, Heidi Duckler Dance (HDD), is proud to be the first company from the United States ever invited to participate in the <u>Dança em Trânsito Festival</u> based in Rio de Janeiro!

In 2024, Dança em Trânsito will visit approximately 33 cities across Brazil and three international locations, reaching over 1,000 audience members in each city. The festival's primary focus is on fostering exchanges between cultures, languages, expressions, and techniques, allowing for the translation of diverse worldviews, promoting freedom for innovation, and providing maximum support for the creation of new concepts in dance.

As a participating company in the festival, HDD will develop unique work for its performances in two vibrant cities, São Paulo and Rio de Janeiro. To prepare, Heidi Duckler and her team will explore each site in advance, engaging with the locations where their choreography will unfold. This process of on-site rehearsal, open to the public, not only showcases artistic development but also invites spectators to witness the creative journey firsthand.

Heidi and HDD dancers, Marissa Brown, Colleen Loverde, and Joseph Stevens, will journey to Brazil on Tuesday, July 23rd, 2024, with the tour beginning in São Paulo and concluding in Rio Janeiro. HDD performs on Friday, July 27th, 2024 in the foyer of Teatro J. Safra in São Paulo, and Friday, August 2nd, 2024 in the foyer at The Banco do Brasil Cultural Center in Rio. During their trip, Heidi and her dancers will film a short, site-specific film to commemorate this once-in-a-lifetime experience.

Initially founded in 1985, Heidi Duckler Dance is a pioneer in producing interdisciplinary performances. The company develops and rehearses each multi-sensory experience in the site where the work is performed. Heidi Duckler Dance advances social equity in under-resourced communities by providing opportunities for audience members and students to interact with meaningful spaces, both public and private, that they may not otherwise have access to.

These innovative experiences allow participants to view these places, and their communities, in new and interesting ways. For 38 years, HDD's Artistic Director, Heidi Duckler, has created over 500 original works locally, nationally and internationally, including in many LA neighborhoods such as: Downtown LA (the Historic Core, Arts District, Produce District and Fashion District), Boyle Heights, Koreatown, Studio City, Van Nuys, Hollywood, Venice, San Pedro and South LA just to name a few. Duckler's work has been internationally recognized in Hong Kong (Hong Kong Urban Arts Festival 2007), Russia (Link Vostok International East-West Arts Exchange 2010), Montreal (Transatlantique Quartier 2013), Germany



(Tanzmesse, 2014 and 2018), Australia (Brisbane Festival 2014), Cuba (Ciudad en Movimiento 2016) and Chile (Puerto de Ideas 2018).

Heidi Duckler is the founder and artistic director of Heidi Duckler Dance in Los Angeles. California and Heidi Duckler Dance/Northwest in Portland, Oregon. Titled the "reigning gueen of site-specific performance" by the LA Times, Duckler is a pioneer of place-based contemporary practice. Her methodology emphasizes how dance, born from individual experience, can be a tool for awareness. Duckler's 2019 short film "Where We're Going" was recently selected for the 2023 Aphelion Film Festival, and her 2022 film "The Tender Bondy Sings" was selected for the 2023 IndieFEST Film Awards Festival. In September. Duckler will speak at the Creatives in Conversation Conference held by the American Institute of Architects, Los Angeles chapter.

Currently, Duckler is on faculty at the University of California, Santa Barbara in the Film and Media Studies Department.

Duckler earned a BS in dance from the University of Oregon and an MA in choreography from UCLA. She also served as a board member of the University of Oregon's School of Music and Dance Advancement Council. Her awards include the Distinguished Dance Alumna award from the University of Oregon School of Music and Dance; the Dance/USA and the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation's Engaging Dance Audiences Award; and the National Endowment of the Arts American Masterpiece award.
